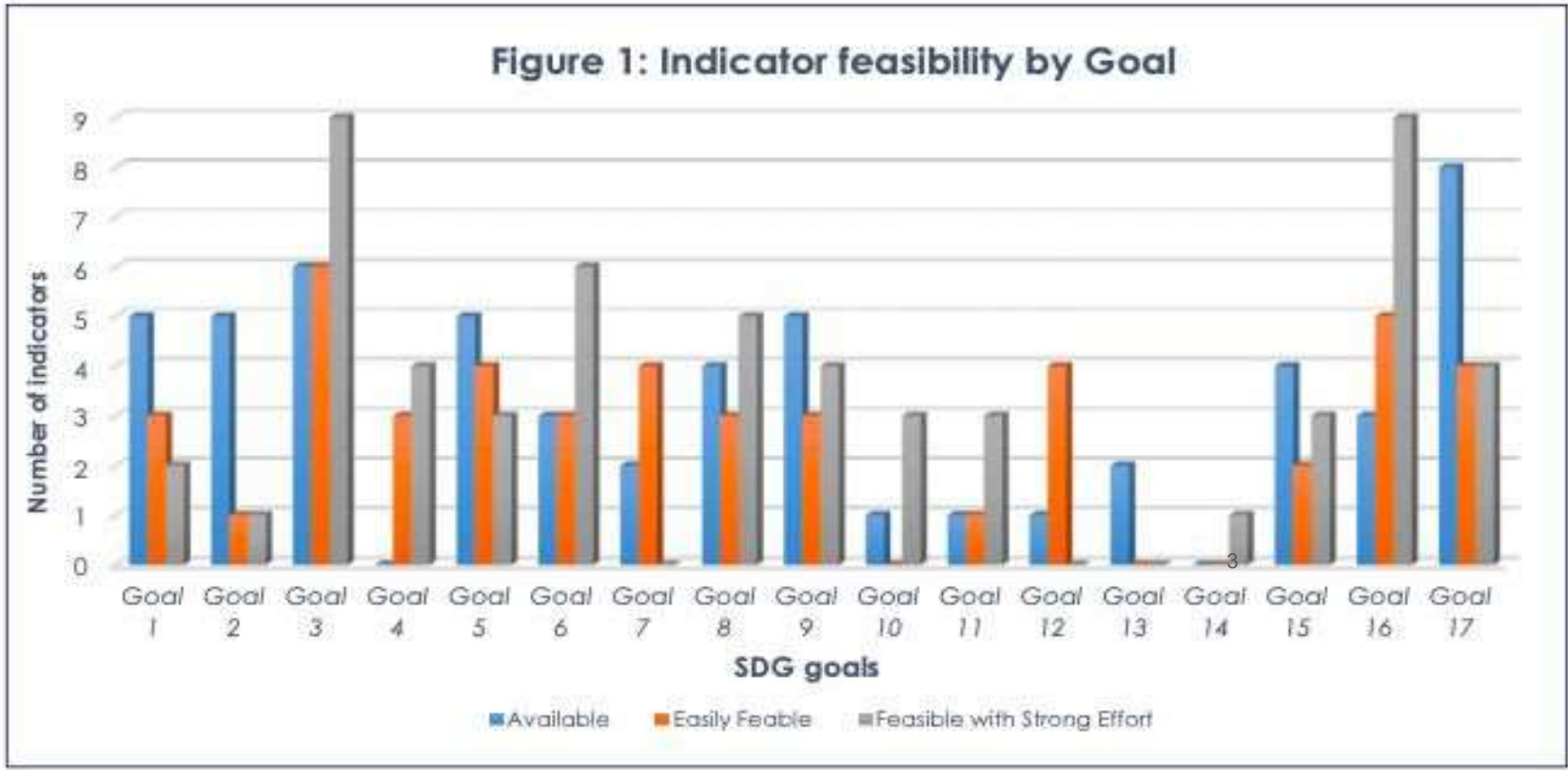

Key challenges and lessons learnt

Key challenges

- Limited national statistical capacity: affects timely availability of reliable data needed analytical studies;
- Dwindling and unpredictable disbursement financial resources: derail program delivery and in responding to requests; and
- COVID-19 pandemic: affected timely implementation of planned initiatives

Lessons learnt

- Strengthening collaboration with UN agencies/other institutions with country level presence is key: establishing working relationships for data sharing;
- Leverage available data from development and humanitarian partners
- Strengthening inter-divisional collaboration through joint planning is critical: leverage resources and impact;
- Leveraging use of ICTs to convene meetings is key in programme delivery during pandemic
