## SDG Indicator Framework on Disability

"Promote, protect and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by all persons with disabilities, and promote respect for their inherent dignity."

## Article 1 of the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities

The development of the framework was based on a publication entitled "<u>ESCWA disability framework: 115 indicators to</u> <u>bridge the gap between policy and statistics</u>", which included a thorough assessment of SDG indicators and their metadata to capture all SDG indicators that are disability related and disaggregated by disability status. The assessment revealed 41 mentions of the words "disability", "vulnerable populations" or "disadvantaged groups" in the indicators, their targets and metadata. The SDG Indicator Framework on Disability includes 69 indicators distributed over 14 Goals.
