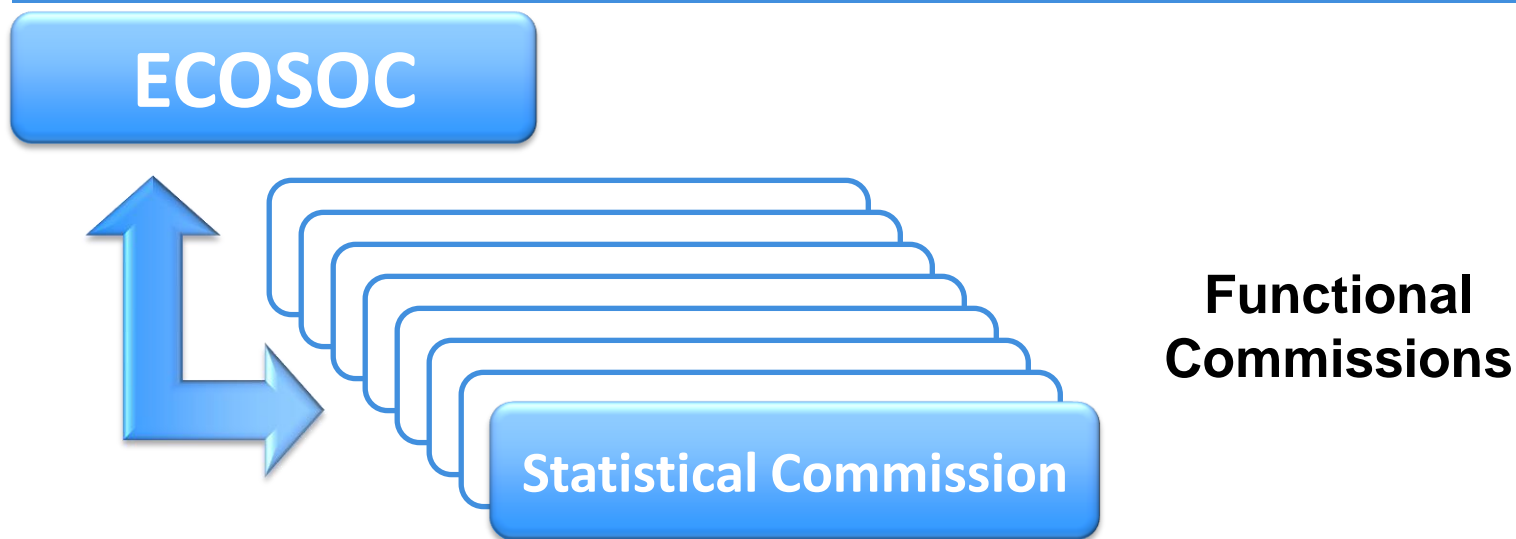

- NGOs (International Statistical Institute,...)

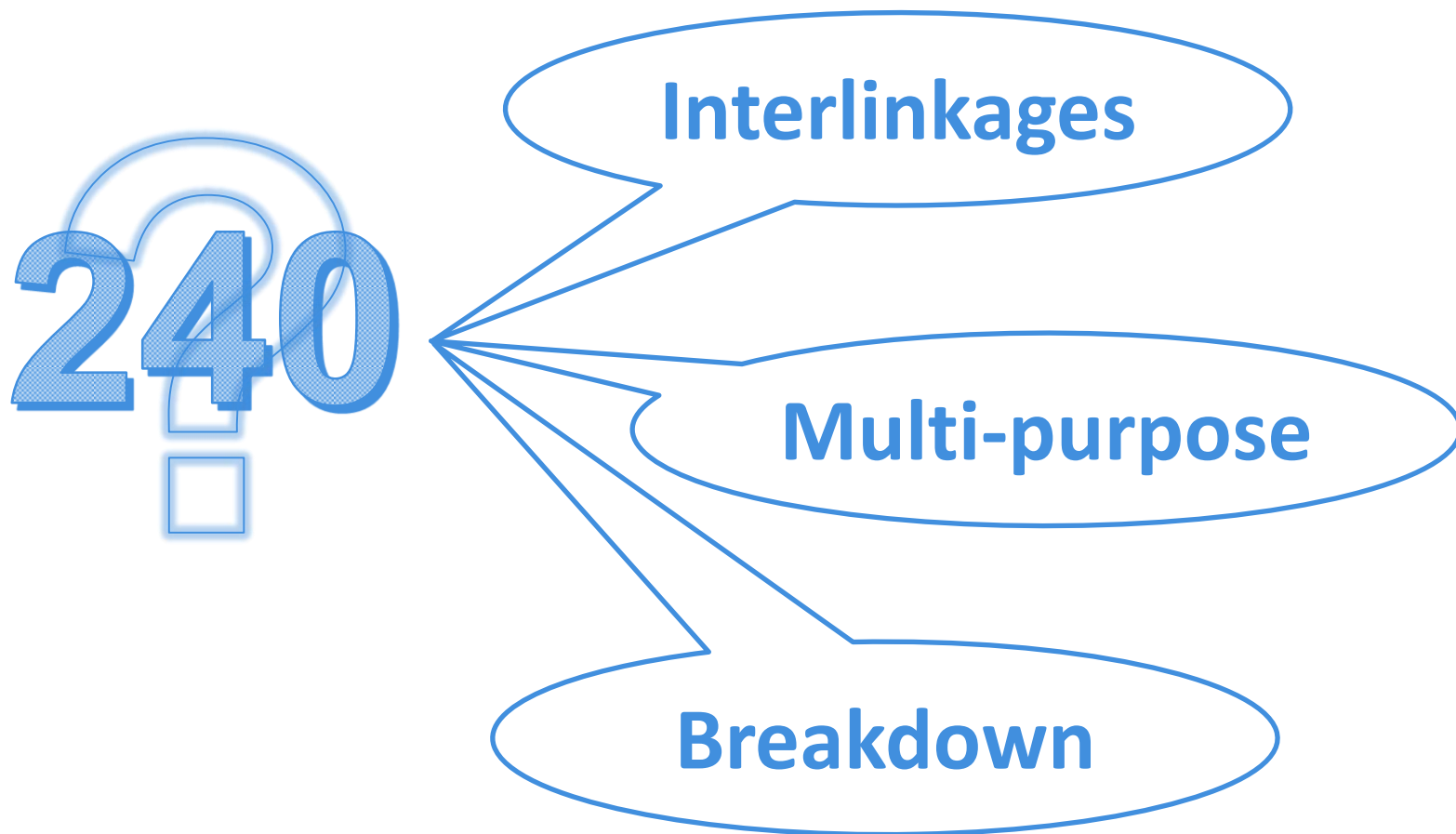

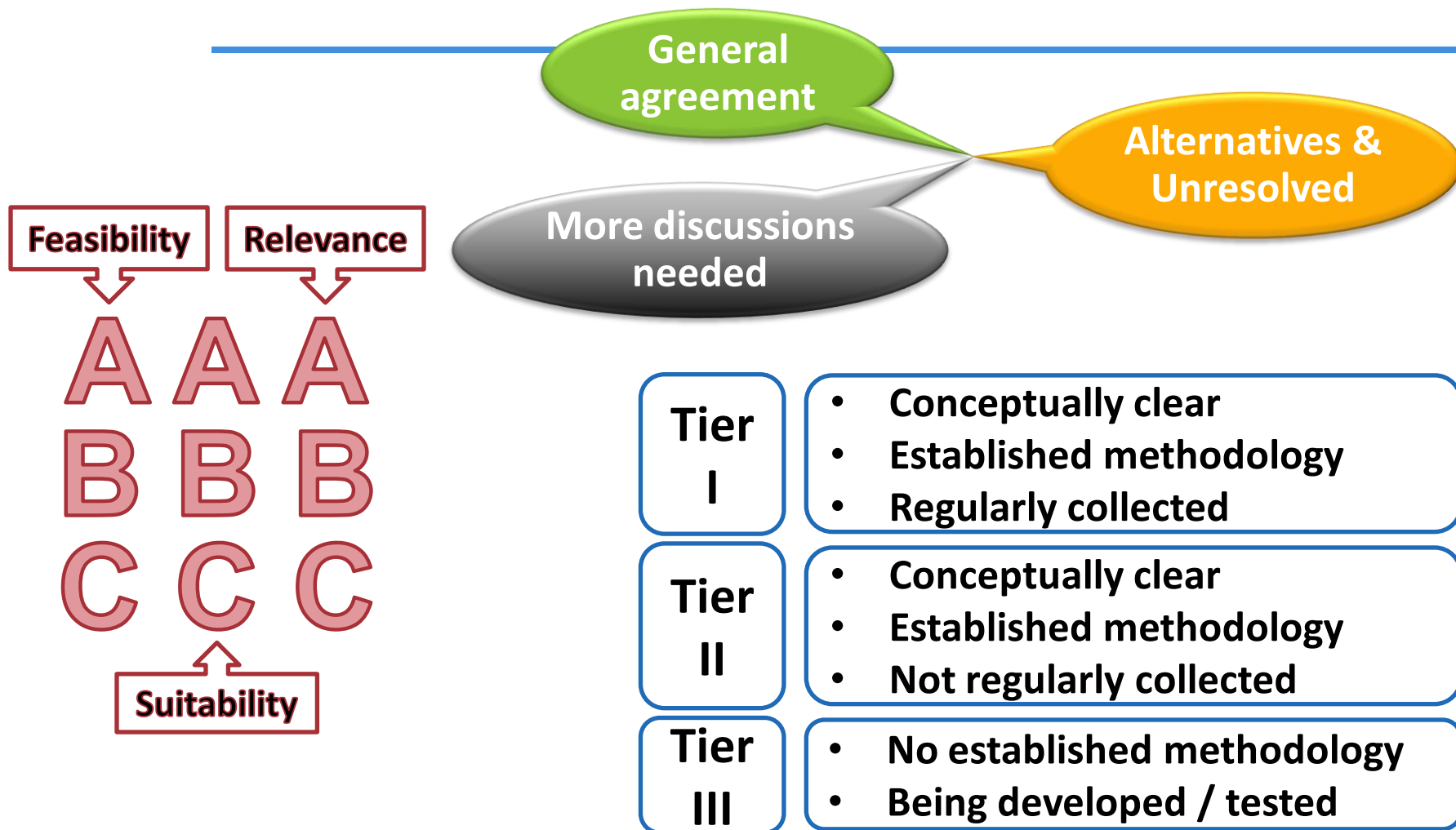

## Decisions of the 47<sup>th</sup> session of the UN Statistical Commission



## Item 3(a) Framework of indicators for the 2030 Agenda



### Decision 1

- **Adopted initial framework of 240 global indicators**
  - Establish Tier system
  - Develop methodologies for Tier III
  - Work on definitions and standards with a view of comparability
  
- **Global reporting, may not be applicable to the national context**
  
- **Compilation of indicators based on the comparable and standardized national statistics**

## Item 3(a) Framework of indicators for the 2030 Agenda



### Decision 2

- **High Level Group on Partnership, Coordination and Capacity Development (HLG)**
  - Focal point for coordinating with partners
  - Addressing data and statistical gaps pertaining to SDGs
  
- **UN World Forum on Sustainable Development Data**
  
- **Statistical Capacity Development**
  - Joint subgroup of the HLG and IAEG-SDG

## Item 3(e) System of Environmental Econ. Accounting (SEEA)



### Decision 6

- **Committee of Experts on Environmental Economic Accounting (SEEA)**
  - **Contribute to the development of metadata for relevant SDG indicators (ref.: Decision 1)**
  - **Scale up implementation of SEEA**
    - **SEEA Central Framework**
    - **SEEA Experimental Ecosystem Accounting**
    - **In-depth training courses**
  - **Finalize SEEA Energy and SEEA Agriculture**

- **Capacity development in environment statistics**
  - Regional
  - Sub-regional
  - National
  
- **Existing frameworks**
  - Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction
  - UNECE Task Force on Climate-Change Statistics
  - Multi-year programme of the Statistical Commission

### Decision 14

- **Improved regional cooperation and coordination in statistical capacity development**
- **Addressing requests from countries in the region**
- **Challenges – new data requirements for the development of the SDG indicators**
