SDG indicators data availability in the Arab region



Reporting is encouraged according to the SDG Indicators Framework

A quick look at the UN SDG Indicators shows us that there are 244 global indicators (232 unique ones), with the following Tiers

(<https://unstats.un.org/sdgs/iaeg-sdgs/tier-classification/>):

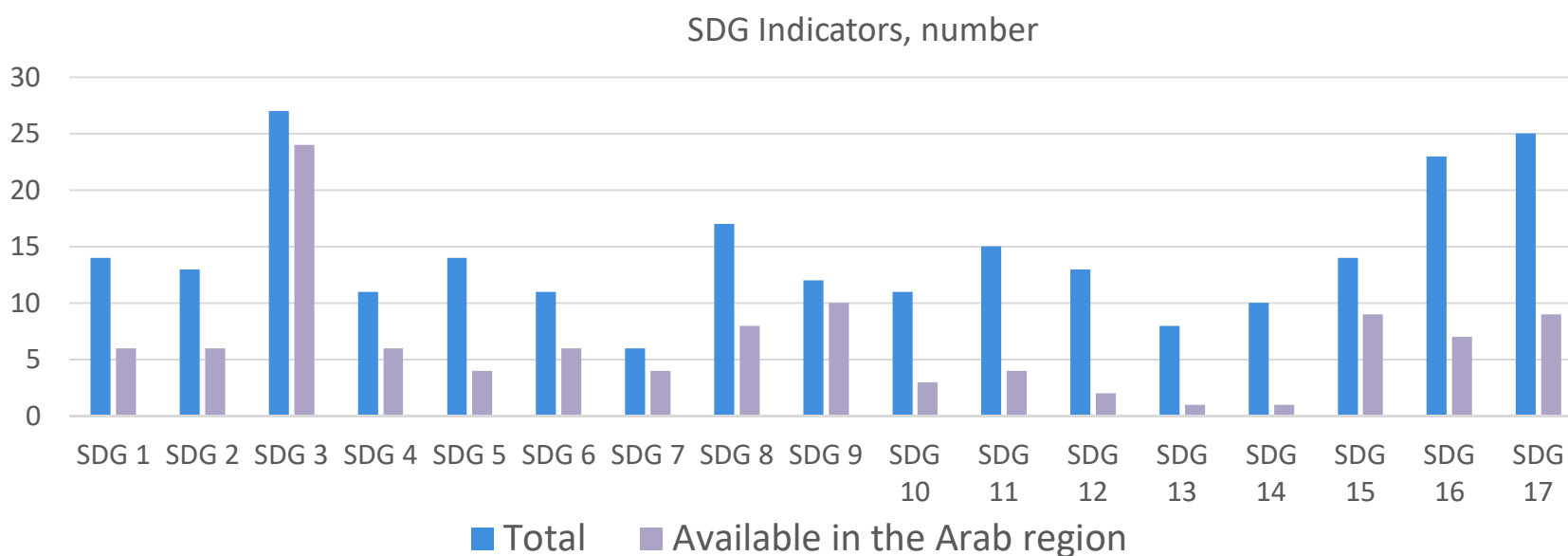
- Tier I: 104 indicators,
- Tier II: 89 indicators,
- Tier III: 33 indicators
- 6 indicators have multiple Tiers

Looking at data availability in the Arab region: less than half of those are available for the Arab region in the last decade, with variations between countries.

SDG indicators data availability in the Arab region by SDG



Lack of disaggregated data (sex, age, urban/rural) also remains a challenge

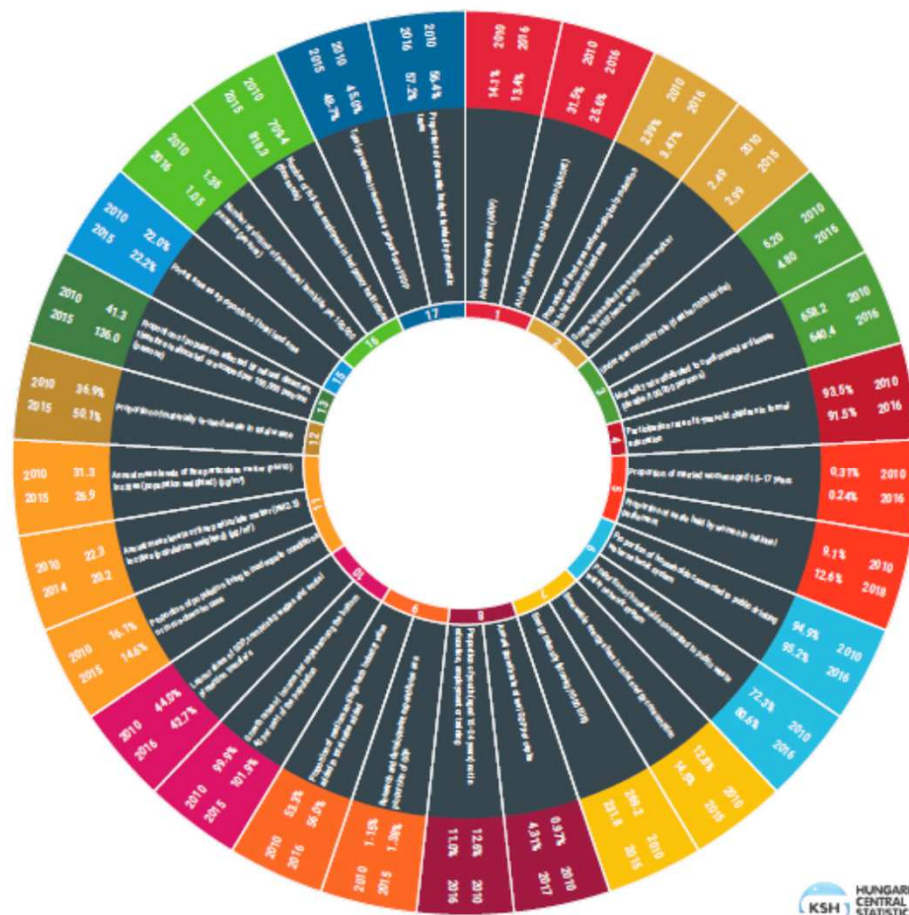
How Arab countries plan to address the data gap (according to VNRs)

- Improving statistical capacity of institutions and individuals
- Improving the quality and frequency of data and its collection
- Strengthening coordination and information sharing between different parts of the government and national statistical systems
- Creating and strengthening centralized statistical databases
- Developing and supporting new and innovative data sources (e.g. big data)

What seems to be missing, is a commitment to disaggregation of data (SDG 17.18).

Examples

- An interactive website where information on key global indicators can be found regarding all SDGs, but also information on a variety of national indicators
- To the right is a visual representation for promotional purposes, but the value added lies in the accessible online database

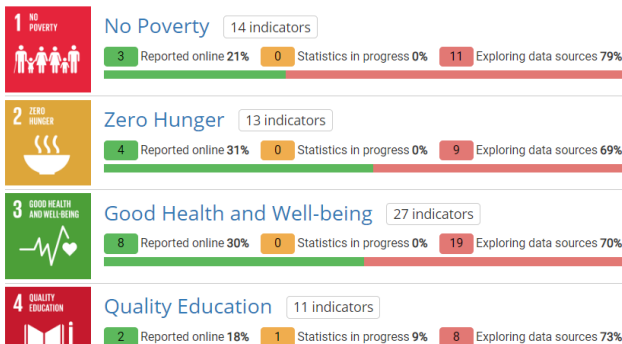
- Ghana recently launched its SDG portal: it lists all SDG data progress, within SDG data situation, and also situation by indicator, and allows for downloads: e.g. of education:

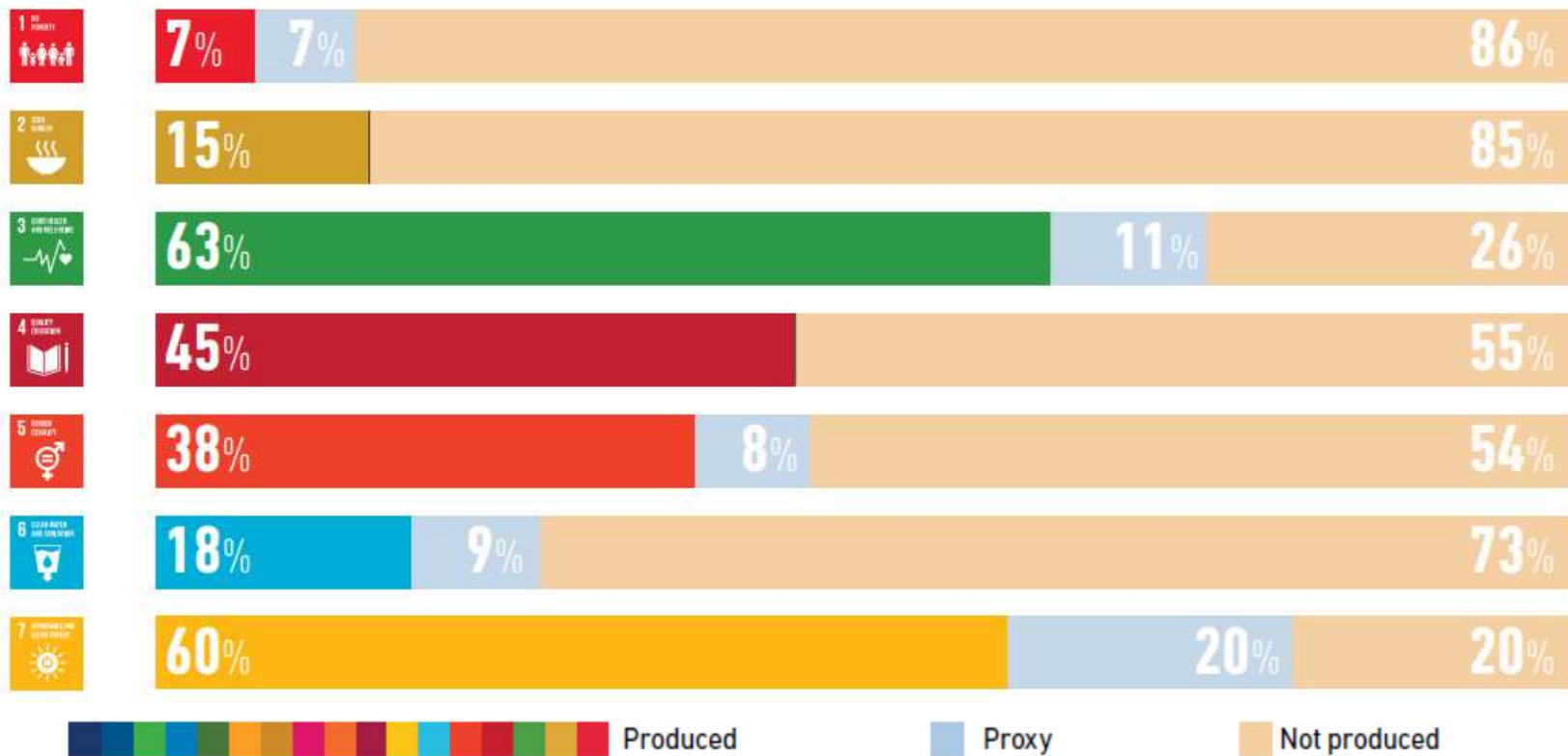

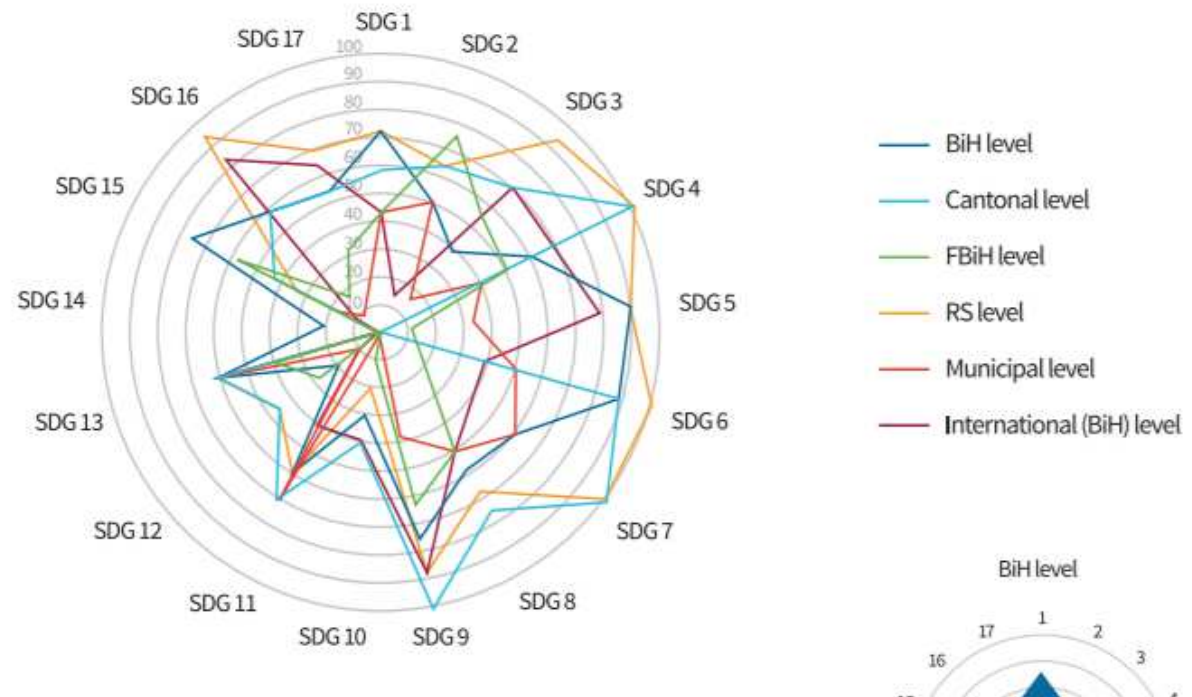

Some suggestions for the new generation of VNRs



- What is being reported needs to be clear and visually accessible
- Include a simple description or explanatory text
- Use simple language and accessible numbers
- Include clear references under tables and figures
- Use dashboards and radial charts when showing achievements/progress over several areas
- Use infographs
- Utilize maps when presenting subnational data
- Use network graphs for interlinkages
