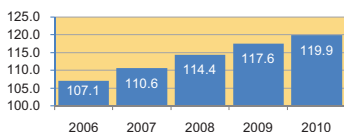

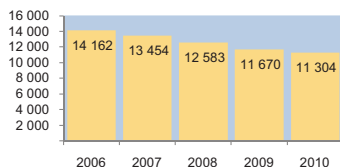

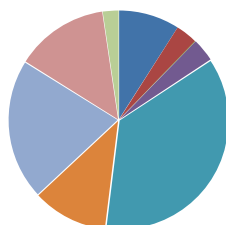
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

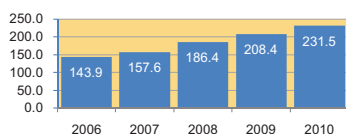

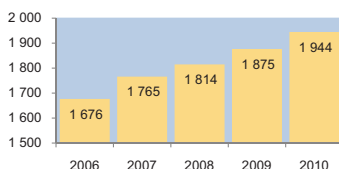

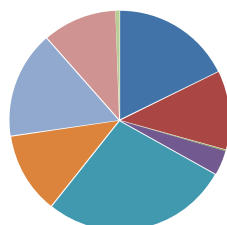
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

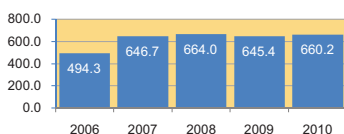

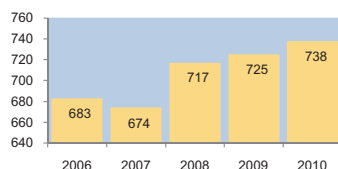

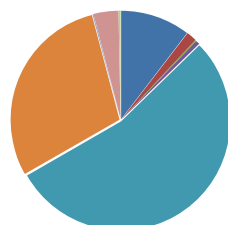
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

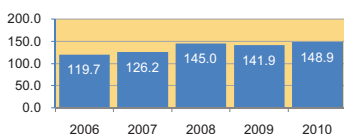

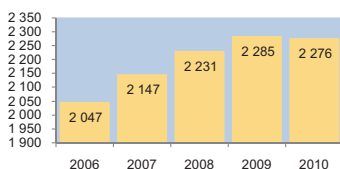

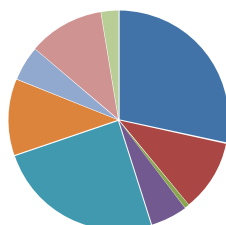
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

Value added of manufacturing industries classified by ISIC - Rev.3 (%), 2009



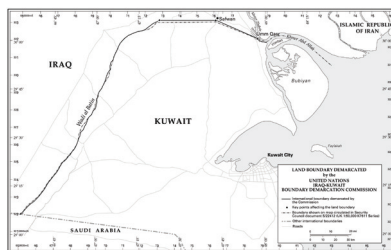

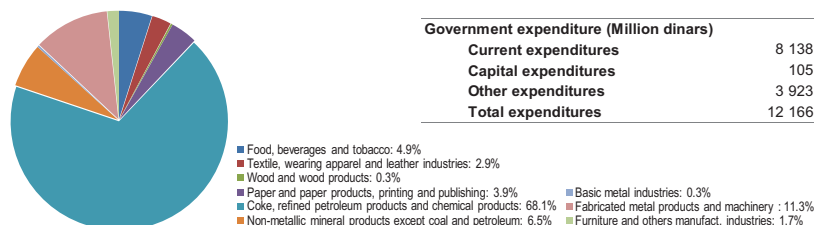
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

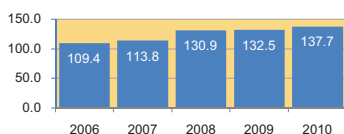

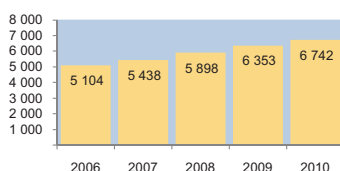

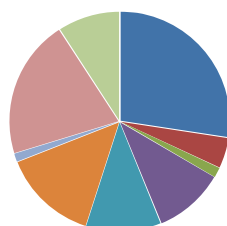
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

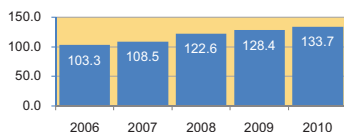

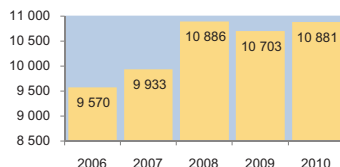

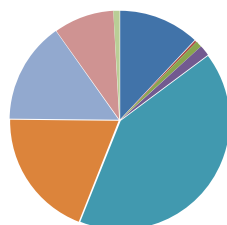
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

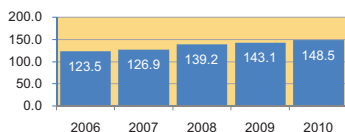

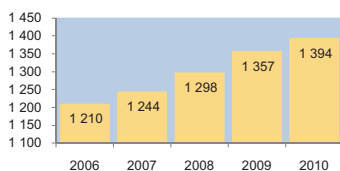

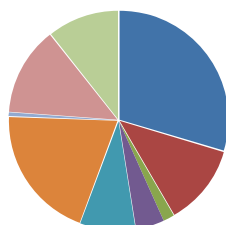
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

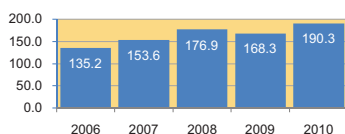

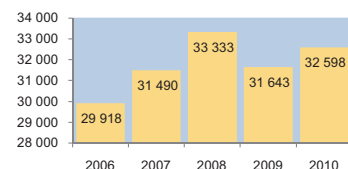

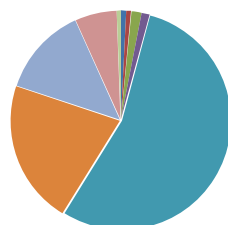
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

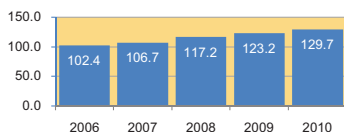

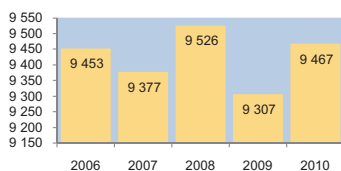

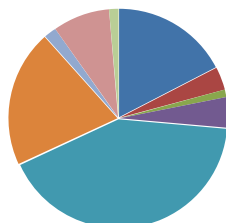
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

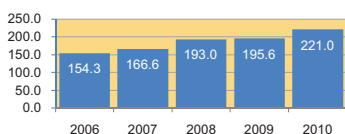

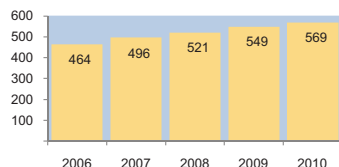

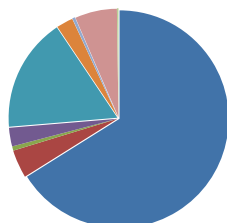
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

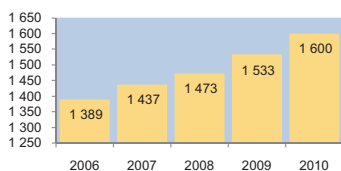

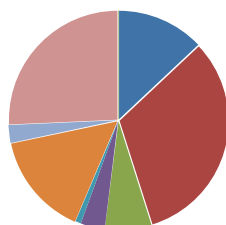
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

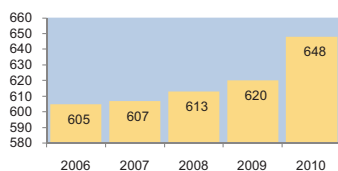

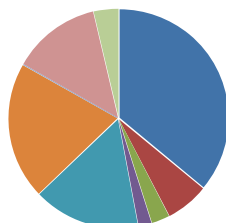
Consumer Price Index (base year 2000)

DEFINITIONS

Population

Total population

The de facto mid-year population, covering all residents, regardless of legal status or citizenship, except refugees not permanently settled in the country of asylum.

Average population growth rate (%)

The average annual rate of change in the total population over a five-year period, starting and ending in the middle of the indicated years.

Proportion of children (%) (0-14 years)

The percentage of children aged 0-14 years out of total population.

Proportion of elderly (%) (65+ years)

The percentage of elderly aged 65 years and older out of total population.

Total fertility rate (live births per woman)

The number of children a woman would have by the end of her reproductive period if she experienced the current prevailing age-specific fertility rate throughout her childbearing life. It is reported as an annual average for five-year periods starting and ending in the middle of the indicated years.

Life expectancy

The average number of years of life expected for a hypothetical cohort of individuals if subject throughout their lives to the mortality rates of a given period, expressed in years.

National Accounts

GDP at current prices

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at current prices is an aggregate measure of production equal to the sum of the gross values added of all resident institutional units engaged in production (plus any taxes, and minus any subsidies, on products not included in the value of their outputs).

GDP at constant prices

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at constant prices refers to the volume level of GDP. Constant price estimates of GDP are obtained by expressing values in terms of a base period.

GDP per capita at constant prices

The average share for a country resident from GDP at constant prices. It is measured by dividing GDP at constant prices by the total population.

Financial Statistics and Prices

Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures changes over time in the general level of prices of goods and services that a reference population acquires, uses or pays for.

Government tax revenues

The sum of all government inflows that are classified as taxes, composed of compulsory transfers to the governmental sector.

Government non-tax revenues

The sum of all government inflows that are classified as non-tax, composed of revenues from social contributions, grants, property income, sales of goods and services, and miscellaneous other revenues.

Total government revenues

Sum of government tax and non-tax revenues.

Current government expenditure

Government spending on items that are consumed and only last a limited period of time. These items are used up in the process of providing a good or service. It includes expenditure on wages and salaries and expenditure on consumables- stationery, drugs and health services etc.

Capital government expenditure

Government spending on assets and capital formation. It is the purchase of items that will last and will be used time and time again in the provision of a good or service. It includes expenditure on new facility projects such as building a new hospital, the purchase of new computer equipment or networks, building new roads etc.

Other government expenditure

Special expenses which appropriate funds for a specific purpose, for example, to finance a particular project or program.

Total government expenditure

Sum of the current, capital, and other government expenditures.

Foreign Trade

Imports (CIF)

Goods and commodities which add to the stock of material resources of a country by entering its economic territory. The value of imports is calculated on Cost, Insurance and Freight (CIF) basis. The value represents all costs incurred until delivery of goods to the port of entry, apart from the customs duties.

Exports and re-exports (FOB)

Exports are goods and commodities leaving the statistical territory of a country. Re-exports are foreign goods exported in the same state as previously imported, from the free circulation area, premises for inward processing or industrial free zones, directly to the rest of the world and from premises for customs warehousing or commercial free zones, to the rest of the world. Export values are calculated on Free on Board (FOB) basis, which includes the value of commodities plus all expenses up to the exporting office/port or the value of commodity free on board or at the centre of the exporting establishment.

Balance of trade

The difference between exports and imports of goods and services.

Education and Illiteracy

Adult Illiteracy rate (15+)

Percentage of the population aged 15 years and older who cannot read, write and understand a short simple statement on his/her everyday life.

Gross enrolment ratio

Total enrolment in a specific level of education, regardless of age, expressed as a percentage of the eligible official school-age population corresponding to the same level of education in a given school year.

Net enrolment ratio

Enrolment in a specific level of education, of the official age group for that level, expressed as a percentage of the total population.

Labour Force

Unemployment rate (%)

The unemployed population comprises all persons above a specified age who during the reference period were without work, currently available for work and seeking work divided by the total corresponding labour force.

Industry

Value added of manufacturing industries classified by the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) – Rev 3(%)

The value added from manufacturing industries, defined as the physical or chemical transformation of materials or components into new products, whether the work is performed by power-driven machines or by hand, whether it is done in a factory or in the worker's home, and whether the products are sold at wholesale or retail.

Air pollution

Carbon dioxide emissions (thousand metric tons per year)

Total emissions of CO₂ from energy, transport, fuel combustion, services, households, etc. as well as from industrial processes, such as the production of cement.

Per capita carbon dioxide emission (metric tons per year)

Total emissions of CO₂ from energy, transport, fuel combustion, services, households, etc. as well as from industrial processes divided by the total population.

Energy

Total energy production (‘000 TOE)

Production covers indigenous production and the manufacture of secondary fuel products. Indigenous production is the extraction of primary fuels from fossil reserves and biofuel sources as well as the capture of renewable energy from water, wind, sunlight, etc.

Total energy consumption (‘000 TOE)

Energy consumption covers the delivery of commodities to consumers for activities other than fuel conversion or transformation activities. Energy commodities are considered consumed rather than transformed.
